We have two staff governors, one local authority appointed governor, two elected parent governors, and six foundation governors. Governors meet regularly to monitor and review school procedures and policies, as well as support school activities. The School Day

The gate opens at 8.40 a.m. so that the school day can start promptly at 8.45 a.m. with registration.

During the morning the children normally enjoy a range of adult and child led tasks, including phonics and maths activities. They engage in long periods of child initiated play where they have access to activities inside and out. Adults spend time engaging in play with children to develop their vocabulary, conversations skills and facilitating sharing and cooperation

Children are able to self-select a snack when they are hungry and are often reminded to drink water from their named bottle.

Lunch is at 12 noon and Class 1 always go first. The children are helped to select their food and staff, alongside older children, monitor each table to help with cutting up food and to talk to the children.

In the afternoon our learning continues. Children are able to access all areas of learning with activities which encourage creative, physical and emotional development and which foster an understanding of the world. You will receive a Parent Leaflet about the topic each term. This gives you lots of information about what your child is learning. The books we read with children are carefully chosen to inspire learning through play.

Adventure Playground

We are lucky to have a wonderful adventure playground and fitness trail. Each class is allocated a day a week of exclusive use. Girls need to put shorts or leggings on if they are wearing a dress.

Awards

The school has a system of rewarding children for their efforts. There are certificates for outstanding effort and Star Awards each week for attitude to learning and behaviour. Children are also encouraged to bring in achievements from outside of school for our Celebration Assembly. Stars are worn for the week and returned the following Friday.

School Website

Communicating your child's progress

Close communication between home and school supports your child's progress and helps us to make learning relevant for your child. Your child's teacher is on the playground every day, after school and you are welcome to speak to them then. Alternatively, if you give the office a ring the teacher will call you back at the soonest convenient time. More formally, progress is reported termly through parents' meetings and also in an end of year report. In book bags, children will bring home a little red communication book. This is to record any messages or to let teachers know about anything significant happening in your child's life. This also records what they read at home. This is a two- way communication book so please note any messages you'd like the teacher to know. We are always happy to speak with parents and Laura Whateley (Headteacher) is happy to meet with you any time.

Curriculum

Having recently rewritten our Early Years curriculum, we are confident that what we teach and when is carefully thought about, addresses the needs of our children, and brings learning to life. We have 6 key strands and by the end of your child's Nursery and Reception years, they will be able to:

- Use a range of tools (from peelers and spades to pencils and paintbrushes).
- Celebrate diversity in modern Britain (and understand how different families can be and what festivals they celebrate).
- Grow and prepare their own food (from cress to potatoes, with the help of our wonderful school cook, Alison)
- Retell stories using ambitious language (which will be vital in their early writing)

Know and use signs of Makaton (so they can communicate with people who have difficulties with verbal communication but this also helps develop understanding of language)

Additionally, to this, we follow the national curriculum and early years framework. Children have maths and phonics input daily and a focus on physical skills and personal and social development. More information on our curriculum can be found on our website.

Forest school

Every class in the school participates in forest school during the year, including our Reception and Nursery children. This encourages teamwork and an appreciation of the natural world. This session is child-led and Mr Gilby, our forest school leader, gives children risk-taking opportunities in a carefully planned way. As a church school, we believe a love of nature is part of children's spiritual development.

Reading

When your Reception child starts school they will receive a plastic wallet with a sound book inside. Each new sound taught in school will be dated. Your child will then begin to bring home words. These words are for sounding out and blending to read. Please help your child to practise their sounds and read the words each day. Please record how this is going in their Link Book. The Nursery children will be introduced to sounds when they are ready.

At the appropriate time your child will also bring home a reading book. You will need to write in the Link Book when they have read their book with you at home. It is important to encourage your child to read regularly with you; this could be their school book, books from home, the library and words they see around them.

Music and Collective Worship

On Tuesday afternoons, Mrs Lauder leads a singing session with Class 1 children.

Reception children are also involved in whole school collective worship which is usually led by Revd. Jane Banister, our school vicar, or Mrs Whateley. On a Friday we have Celebration Assembly and children throughout the school share achievements from outside of school.

Events out of school

If your child receives a trophy, has a souvenir from a special trip or a special photo or item of interest then they are welcome to bring this in to share.

Holiday in School Time

Once a child turns 5, absence during term time due to holiday is unauthorised. There is a form available on the school website to inform the School Office of the absence in advance.

Medicines

Should your child require prescription medicine whilst at school you will need to fill in a medicine form for the School Office. These can be found on the school website (click here).

Clubs for Reception to Year 6



There are various clubs before and after school as well as at lunchtime. These include martial arts, French, drama, traditional crafts, drama, adventure and multi sports. At the end of each term you will receive information about all the clubs available for the following term, any cost involved and how your child can join. We also offer breakfast and after school club which runs from 8-8.45 and 3.15-5.30 Mon-Thurs and 3.15-4.30 Friday.

Lost Property

We can't stress surongly enough that all your child's clothes are labelled, particularly clothes with the school logo as they all look alike. Named clothes can be easily returned. If you do lose something, please ask if you can have a look around the cloakroom after school when it is empty. They will do their best to help you find the missing belongings. It is helpful if you can emphasise to your child the importance of keeping their things together in their bag in the cloakroom.

PE

Class 1 have PE activities **twice a week.** Please ensure your child wears their PE kit with them on PE days.

School Houses

Each child will become a member of one of the school houses: Larks (blue), Martins (yellow) or Swifts (red). The children collect house points for their work and behaviour throughout the week. Each Friday the House Trophy is awarded in assembly to the winning house. Sports Day in the summer term finds the houses competing against each other. Siblings are always put in the same house to make cheering easier for the parents!

Nut Free

As some of our children have severe allergies to new we are a **NUT** free school. Please check any packed lunch items that are sent into school to ensure we keep our children safe. This also applies if you send in any cakes into school for example for cake sales or the Christmas Fair.

Parking



Parking **inside the school grounds** is not allowed and **is for staff cars only.** If you do drive to school, we would be grateful if you would park behind the Village Hall and use the crossing patrol. It is better not to park on the road as this obscures the view for the crossing patrol and makes it difficult for the school bus to manoeuvre. The front of the hall is for hall users during the day.

Child Safety

For your child's safety there are security locks on the doors into school. If you need to get into school at anytime please ring the door bell at the main entrance.

Footwear

We ask that children wear plain black trainers so that they can run safely. All shoes should be fastened with Velcro please. These trainers will be used for indoors, playtime and PE lessons.

Discussing your Child's Progress

There are formal Parent Consultation evenings during the Autumn and Spring term where you have an opportunity to discuss your child's progress with your child's teacher. All children receive a School Report during the Summer term. However, if you would like to talk to the teacher at another time you could make an appointment through the School Office or speak to Mrs Garner-Veal or Mrs Buckley after school. Any questions can also be asked through the Link Book, which your child will receive at the start of the term. School life is busy but we will always make time to speak with parents about their child.

Absence

If your child will be absent from school, you need to have notified the School Office by 9.30 a.m. on each day of absence, via the email address parents@longmarston.herts.sch.uk.

Uniform

All class 1 children wear school uniform. We suggest nursery children wear jogging bottoms (grey/black) or leggings so they can go to the toilet quickly.



Arriving and Leaving School



School starts at 8.45 a.m. Please try to be prompt as some children get upset if they are late for school. However don't come too early, a few minutes before the bell goes is fine. **Please note the bell is rung at 8.40 a.m.** so pupils are ready for lessons at 8.45 a.m.

In the first few days, it is tempting to want to go into the cloakroom with your child however, space is limited and we would prefer if you could leave your child with Mrs Garner-Veal and Mrs Buckley. They will soon settle into the routine of taking off their coats and sorting out their belongings.

In the first week your children will have a staggered entry. Details on welcome letter. When your child is part time you will need to collect them from the main entrance of the school.

The bell for the **end of school goes at 3.15 p.m.** Children who are taking the coach home leave school first. The bell is only rung once the coach has left so it is inevitable that occasionally the children are a little late out, please be patient. You collect your child from the playground at the back of the school.
